

#### **DAY CAMP**

#### Boys and girls ages 6-10 June 16-19

Young players will learn soccer fundamentals, including technical skills and game rules. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing. Each camper will receive hands-on instruction from college coaches, based on the player's level of skill and tactical development. Each camper will receive giveaway items. If camp is canceled twice due to rain, makeup will be Friday, June 20.

#### **ELITE CAMP**

#### Boys and girls ages 10-14 June 16-19

Youth players will learn high-level technical skills and basic tactical strategies. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing, as well as creating space, combination plays, transition play, and styles of play. Each camper will receive intensive instruction from coaches, based on skill and tactical development, as well as video analysis of technical abilities. Goalkeeper training will be available. Each camper will receive giveaway items.

# **GK ACADEMY**

#### Boys and girls ages 12-18 June 19-Aug. 1, Wed. or Thurs. nights

Youth players will learn high-level technical skills and basic tactical strategies. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing, as well as creating space, combination plays, transition play, and styles of play. Each camper will receive intensive instruction from coaches, based on skill and tactical development, as well as video analysis of technical abilities. Goalkeeper training will be available. Each camper will receive giveaway items.



### **PREMIER CAMP**

#### Young women ages 14-18 July 17-19

Premier players will prepare for high-level high school soccer and the college game by learning through small-sided games, a technical session, and a full-sided game. Goalkeeper training will be available throughout the day. Sessions will cover mental and physical aspects of the game to teach players the motivational skills required for high-level competition. Each camper will recieve a T-shirt and a soccer bag.

### **FACILITIES**

Campers will utilize some of the best outdoor facilities in the lowa Conference. Camp drills and game action will be at Knights Soccer Complex and Walston-Hoover Stadium.

### **PARENTS**

Each registered camper will receive a confirmation letter, including map and directions, rules and regulations, and check-in information. On the final day of each session, parents are invited to observe their sons and daughters during the instruction period. All participants are required to comply with the rules and regulations of Wartburg College and the Sports Camps. Any violation of these rules will result in immediate dismissal from the camp.



### **CAMP DIRECTOR**

**Head Coach Tiffany Pins**, a 2005 Wartburg graduate, is entering her fourth year at the helm of the women's soccer program.

In her first season the Knights finished 17-2-3, claimed a share of the lowa Conference regular-season crown,

qualified for the conference tournament, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament. Nine players were named All-Conference and three were named All-Region, a first for the program. The squad also set the single-season record with 12 shutout wins.

In 2012 the Orange and Black finished 12-5-3, qualified for the conference tournament, and advanced to the NCAA tournament. Eight players were named All-Conference, including Cathy Reiter who was named the conference's MVP. In 2013 the team qualified for the conference tournament and five were named All-Conference.

While playing for Wartburg, Pins (maiden name Treanor), was part of a strong Knights' incline. The three-time program Most Valuable Player and 2004 All-lowa Conference honoree starred on squads that won 10-or-more matches twice, including a 16-3-1 mark during her senior season. As an assistant, she helped lead two teams to 10-or-more victories, including a 14-6 mark in 2005. While an assistant coach at Denison University from 2007 to 2010, the school reached the Elite Eight as part of three NCAA Division III tournament berths. The program also won two regular-season and one North Coast Athletic Conference tournament title.

Pins earned her Master of Arts degree in physical education with an emphasis in teaching and coaching from the University of Northern Iowa. She also has an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

If you fly, transportation to campus will be provided from the Waterloo Municipal Airport, 15 miles south of Waverly. It is important to notify our office at least two weeks prior to camp of your flight number and arrival time. Parking will be provided for campers who drive to Waverly, but they will not be permitted to use their vehicles at any time during the camp.
